The January/February 2021 issue of the IPMS/USA Journal has an article about someone in his eighties building models. This is not unusual for IPMS/El Paso. Connie Harth, now deceased, was building models well into his eighties. In fact, he was building vacu-forms and rigging the models in 1/72nd scale. In addition, at 87, Jim Davis is still building models at an impressive rate. In fact, he paints using spray cans, even though it has become more difficult to find the colors that he needs. Jim builds in 1/48th scale and in 1/72nd scale. He builds U.S. Navy and U.S. Air Force types, both trainers and combat types. At the present time , he has about 30, F-4 Phantoms in 1/48th scale and at least 50 Phantoms in 1/72nd scale. His "Yellow Wing" collection is not only colorful but makes a nice layout for a display. For many years, Jim has been painting with aerosol paint spray cans.
